
Starting with \$500 Mrs. B built Nebraska Furniture Mart into the largest home furnishing store in North America and worked at the store until she was 103 years old!



Think about how you advertise yourself.


Every business needs to promote itself to sell its products and to distinguish itself from the competition. So it's very important for a business to *advertise* itself.

This happened just as all three of Rocket Incorporated's space tourists cancelled their reservations.




None of them had a full understanding of space travel: One tourist was afraid of heights, another hated the thundering engine noises, and the third tourist couldn't fit inside the rocket.
